BCM 506 Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian I 5 Hours

Examine Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, and Serbian languages with an emphasis on proficiency in four skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

BCM 507 Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian II 5 Hours

Examine Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, and Serbian languages with an emphasis on proficiency in four skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

BCM 312K Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian III 3 Hours

Explore Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian languages through listening, speaking, reading, and writing at the second-year level.

BCM 312L Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian IV 3 Hours

Explore Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian languages through listening, speaking, reading, and writing at the second-year level.

BCM 119S, 219S, 319S, 419S, 519S, 619S, 719S, 819S, 919S Topics in Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, and Serbian 1-9 Hours

This course is used to record credit the student earns while enrolled at another institution in a program administered by the University's Study Abroad Office. Credit is recorded as assigned by the study abroad advisor in the academic unit. University credit is awarded for work in an exchange program; it may be counted as coursework taken in residence. Transfer credit is awarded for work in an affiliated studies program.

Examine selected aspects of Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, and Serbian history and culture.
