

Communication and Leadership (CLD)

CLD 301 Introduction to Communication and Leadership 3 Hours

Introduces the study of leadership with an emphasis on communication dimensions and interdisciplinary understanding of social problems.

Serves as a foundation for subsequent coursework in the areas of communication and leadership.

CLD 102, 202, 302 Topics in Communication and Leadership 1-3 Hours

Contemporary issues and practices in communication and leadership.

CLD 303 Leadership Presence and Presentation 3 Hours

Discuss the theory and application of the fundamentals of professional speaking, leader presence, persuasive arguments, and presentations for the modern workforce.

CLD 304 Introduction to Philanthropy 3 Hours

Offers an introduction to philanthropy, focusing on the process of private giving as well as the work of private foundations.

CLD 314 Fundamentals of Philanthropy 3 Hours

Builds on Introduction to Philanthropy, considering the process of creating and evaluating philanthropic initiatives.

CLD 119S, 219S, 319S, 419S, 519S, 619S, 719S, 819S, 919S Topics in Communication and Leadership 1-9 Hours

This course is used to record credit the student earns while enrolled at another institution in a program administered by the University's Study Abroad Office. Credit is recorded as assigned by the study abroad adviser in the College of Communication. University credit is awarded for work in an exchange program; it may be counted as coursework taken in residence. Transfer credit is awarded for work in an affiliated studies program.

CLD 120, 220, 320 Topics in Communication and Leadership 1-3 Hours

Contemporary issues and practices in communication and leadership.

CLD 321 Seminar on Communication and Leadership 3 Hours

Builds on the foundation introduced in Communication and Leadership 301 advancing student work in theories, processes, and practices of leadership and communication.

CLD 122, 222, 322 Independent Study 1-3 Hours

Pursue special supervised individual research studies.

CLD 324 Communication and Leadership in Higher Education 3 Hours

Investigate the ways in which leadership and communication intersect with a range of audiences from students and faculty to parents and legislators.

CLD 325 Leadership in Non-Profit Organizations 3 Hours

Discuss the change-makers in the nonprofit sector, and discover the knowledge, skills, and strategies needed to excel in the art of communication within non-profit leadership.

CLD 129S, 229S, 329S, 429S, 529S, 629S, 729S, 829S, 929S Topics in Communication and Leadership 1-9 Hours

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CLD 330 Philanthropy Capstone 3 Hours

Analyze the effectiveness of nonprofit organizations and how to think about and apply the ethics, strategy, and practice of philanthropic giving.

CLD 332 Facilitative Leadership 3 Hours

Explore facilitation and consensus-building into leadership in the private, nonprofit, and public sectors; how to engage stakeholders in powerful, productive, and prudent ways; and how to collaborate with team members to advance a leader's vision.

CLD 340 Communication for Civic Engagement 3 Hours

Examine theories and applied practices for impactful and effective civic education.

CLD 145, 245, 345 Topics in Fundamentals and Skills 1-3 Hours

Examine contemporary issues and practices in communication and leadership fundamentals and skills.

CLD 151, 351, 651 Internship in Communication and Leadership 1,3,6 Hours

Practical work experience related to the practice of ethical leadership and communication.

CLD 360 Communication for Executive Leadership 3 Hours

Explore the theories, strategies, and skills required for organizational leaders to be effective and lead strong teams.

CLD 165, 265, 365 Topics in Social Issues 1-3 Hours

Study communication and leadership in social issues.

CLD 371 Capstone Course in Communication and Leadership 3 Hours

Engagement in experiential learning. Development and presentation of ideas and plans for addressing a leadership challenge given by a partner organization.

CLD 679 Undergraduate Thesis 6 Hours

Write and research two consecutive semesters under the supervision of a College of Communication faculty member; subjects are selected by the student with approval from the faculty member.
