

Hebrew (HEB)

HEB 601C Intensive Hebrew I 6 Hours

First semester of intensive Hebrew language instruction.

HEB 602C Intensive Biblical Hebrew I 6 Hours

Introduction to the language and texts of the Hebrew Bible, taught in the interactive style of a modern language classroom.

HEB 303K Biblical Hebrew I 3 Hours

Introduction to biblical Hebrew, including basic lexicon and grammar. Focus on reading the Hebrew Bible; including texts such as the Creation, the Tower of Babel, the binding of Isaac, the Joseph story, and the David and Goliath story.

HEB 303L Biblical Hebrew II 3 Hours

Continue to explore a thorough study of biblical Hebrew grammar, with emphasis on the verb system and the rules of sentence structure. Examine texts including biblical chapters of poetic, legal, and prophetic nature, such as the Ten Commandments, chapters from the Book of Leviticus, Psalms 23, 27, and 121, Proverbs 8 and 10, Isaiah 53, and Jeremiah 31.

HEB 506 First-Year Hebrew I 5 Hours

Modern Israeli Hebrew, including the writing system, basic sentence structure, vocabulary, and simple conversation.

HEB 507 First-Year Hebrew II 5 Hours

Continuation of Hebrew 506.

HEB 611C Intensive Hebrew II 6 Hours

Second semester of intensive Hebrew language instruction.

HEB 612C Intensive Biblical Hebrew II 6 Hours

Continuing the study of the language and texts of the Hebrew Bible, taught in the interactive style of a modern language classroom.

HEB 412K Second-Year Hebrew I 4 Hours

Modern Israeli Hebrew. Continuation of Hebrew 507 with expanded grammar and conversation.

HEB 412L Second-Year Hebrew II 4 Hours

Continuation of Hebrew 412K, with emphasis on conversation and composition.

HEB 119S, 219S, 319S, 419S, 519S, 619S, 719S, 819S, 919S Topics in Hebrew 1-9 Hours

This course is used to record credit the student earns while enrolled at another institution in a program administered by the University's Study Abroad Office. Credit is recorded as assigned by the study abroad adviser in the Department of Middle Eastern Studies. University credit is awarded for work in an exchange program; it may be counted as coursework taken in residence. Transfer credit is awarded for work in an affiliated studies program.

Supervised individual study of selected problems in Hebrew language or literature.

Taught in English with readings in Hebrew.

HEB 380C.2 Advanced Readings in Modern Hebrew 3 Hours

HEB 380C.21 The Bible in Hebrew: Genesis through Deuteronomy 3 Hours

Read and analyze Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy in Hebrew.

HEB 380C.22 The Bible in Hebrew: Joshua through Chronicles 3 Hours

Read and analyze the Books of Joshua, Judges, Samuel, Kings, and Chronicles in Hebrew.

HEB 380C.23 The Bible in Hebrew: Isaiah through Book of Twelve 3 Hours

Read and analyze the Books of Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and the Book of the Twelve in Hebrew.

HEB 380C.24 The Bible in Hebrew: Psalms through Nehemiah 3 Hours

Read and analyze the Books of Psalms, Proverbs, Job, Song of Songs, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes, Esther, Daniel, Ezra, and Nehemiah in Hebrew.
