

Slavic and Eurasian Languages (SEL)

SEL 601C Topics in Intensive Slavic and Eurasian Languages I 6 Hours
Emphasis on basic communication skills in Slavic and Eurasian languages: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Includes introduction to Slavic and Eurasian cultures.

SEL 506 Topics in First-Year Slavic and Eurasian Languages I 5 Hours
Emphasis on four-skills proficiency: listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

SEL 507 Topics in First-Year Slavic and Eurasian Languages II 5 Hours
Emphasis on four-skills proficiency: listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

SEL 611C Topics in Intensive Slavic and Eurasian Languages II 6 Hours
Continuing intensive development of communication abilities in Slavic and Eurasian languages with emphasis on the four basic skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Includes an introduction to Slavic and Eurasian cultures.

SEL 312K Topics in Second-Year Slavic and Eurasian Languages I 3 Hours
Listening, speaking, reading, and writing at the second-year level.

SEL 312L Topics in Second-Year Slavic and Eurasian Languages II 3 Hours
Listening, speaking, reading, and writing at the advanced, second-year level.

SEL 119S, 219S, 319S, 419S, 519S, 619S, 719S, 819S, 919S Topics in Slavic and Eurasian Languages 1-9 Hours
This course is used to record credit the student earns while enrolled at another institution in a program administered by the University's Study Abroad Office. Credit is recorded as assigned by the study abroad adviser in the Department of Slavic and Eurasian Studies. University credit is awarded for work in an exchange program; it may be counted as coursework taken in residence. Transfer credit is awarded for work in an affiliated studies program.

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SEL 330 Topics in Slavic and Eurasian Languages 3 Hours
Intermediate or advanced language instruction in a range of individual Slavic and Eurasian languages. Slavic and Eurasian language texts in the original language, writing assignments, and conversation practice to improve language proficiency in all of these modes of communication.

SEL 385 Topics in Slavic and Eurasian Languages 3 Hours

SEL 385.1 Accelerated Romanian for Research 3 Hours
Explore a variety of grammatical and idiomatic features of the Romanian language, and apply this knowledge to the translation of various representative literary, historical, and academic texts from Romanian into English. Survey Romanian history and a limited selection of significant Romanian texts in English translation.
