BCM X12K. Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian III.

Explore Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian languages through listening, speaking, reading, and writing at the second-year level.

BCM X12L. Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian IV.

Explore Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, Serbian languages through listening, speaking, reading, and writing at the second-year level.

BCM X19S. Topics in Bosnian, Croatian, Montenegrin, and Serbian.

Credit is recorded as assigned by the study abroad advisor in the academic unit. University credit is awarded for work in an exchange program; it may be counted as coursework taken in residence. Transfer credit is awarded for work in an affiliated studies program.
