Areas of Study

The Master of Interior Design degree program offers two degree options.

The Master of Interior Design (first professional) degree option may <u>qualify</u> graduates to become licensed or registered as an interior designer. Interested students are encouraged to confirm <u>requirements</u> for the state in which they hope to practice and confirm NCIDQ eligibility <u>requirements</u>.

The Master of Interior Design (post-professional) degree option offers students advanced studies, theory, and research for those holding a prior professional degree in interior design or architecture.

Admission Requirements

Upon admission to the program, students must pay a <u>nonrefundable</u> <u>enrollment deposit</u> to indicate that they accept the offer of admission. The deposit is applied to the payment of tuition when the student enrolls.

Master of Interior Design (first professional). This <u>degree program</u> is open to qualified applicants who hold baccalaureate degrees in any discipline without a prior professional degree in interior design or architecture.

Master of Interior Design (post-professional). This <u>degree program</u> is open to qualified applicants with a prior professional baccalaureate degree in interior design, interior architecture, or architecture.
