Students explore the scientific and theoretical bases of learning through coursework in cognition, development, motivation and social psychology, with the option to earn either a Master of Education (M.Ed.) or Master of Arts (M.A.)

HDCLS emphasizes a learning community model that blends collaborative engagement and mentorship with both peers and faculty across the area. This flexible structure supports a wide variety of academic and professional goals.
